If you have been wondering what your board members do to represent you, their specific responsibilities are the following:

- **President (Bryan Bennett):** Prepares the agenda and chairs board meetings, provides overall direction to the U.R.A. board, interfaces with the USRA, and follows up on tasks assigned to board members.
- **Vice President (Rico Dubach):** Chairs board meeting in the absence of the president, organizes elections and accepts nominations for office, oversees committees for year-end awards, and oversees the tournament liaisons.
- **Secretary (Troy Pattee):** Records board meeting minutes and presents copies to the board at the following meeting, keeps a record

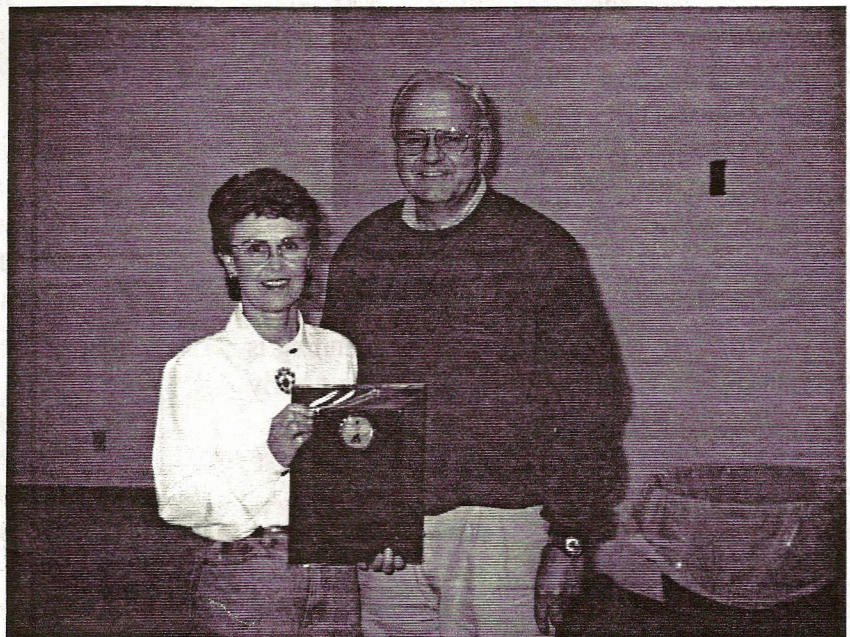
The 12 teams were separated into two divisions for a double-elimination tournament. The final standings ended this way:

book with copies of all previous meetings, keeps current copy of U.R.A. bylaws with the record book, and keeps a copy of the current treasurer's report with the record book.

- **Treasurer (Rose Hernandez):** Manages all U.R.A.-related financial transactions, works with the board to ensure conformance to state and federal law, and prepares a financial report for each board meeting.
- **Sanctioning Director (Val Shewfelt):** Manages current membership lists and rankings from the USRA, distributes membership dues to the USRA and the U.R.A., confirms that tournament results have been properly submitted to the USRA, and distributes a list of new and renewing members to the newsletter director. Chairs the annual tournament director's meeting.
- **Newsletter Director (Hope Hendricks):** Manages, produces, and distributes quarterly newsletters to all U.R.A. members.
- **Annual Directory/Fund-Raising Director (Rico Dubach, Marcus Dunyon):** Coordinates membership lists, advertising, and compilation of annual directory to be distributed with winter newsletter, pursues fundraising opportunities, gathers advertising for the newsletter and directory.
- **Photographer/Publicity Director (Scott Boyd, Marcus Dunyon, Troy Pattee):** Coordinates with each tournament liaison and director for pictures and summary for local newspapers, submits pictures with descriptions for newsletter articles.
- **Traveling League Liaison (Mike Retford):** Works with Ruth McGovern in planning and organizing the traveling league.

- **Collegiate Director (Val Shewfelt):** Works with the Utah collegiate teams in planning and organizing tournaments.
- **Junior Director (Mike Retford):** Works with junior representatives in organizing and running juniors programs.
- **Women's Director (Rose Hernandez, Val Shewfelt, Hope Hendricks):** Runs ladies traveling league and works toward promoting and organizing women's participation in racquetball.
- **Tournament Liaison (All Board Members):** Verifies that each player is a current U.R.A. member, assists the tournament director, and writes an article for the newsletter.

In addition to these specific responsibilities, your board members do many more things to help the U.R.A. membership. We are always looking for assistance because of the many tasks that need to be accomplished. Please let us know if you would like to help!

A Tribute to Karl Doppel

On March 22, 1997, Karl Doppel died in the Holy Cross Hospital. I find it appropriate that he took his leave on the concluding day of the state singles tournament. As the years come and go, this tournament will stand as a memorial to Karl. This will be a time to remember him for the kind of man, racquetball player, and friend he was.

Karl was a good and honest man. I heard many people say, "Karl is honest to his detriment." He told me that it wasn't worth lying over a point because his *integrity* was worth far more than a point. Due to his extreme competitive nature, this had a big impact on me. I knew that anything he was actually WILLING to give up a point for, he really believed in.

Karl was kind to all. A person didn't have to be from the same race, religious background, athletic skill level, or gender. They didn't have to have a college education (like he did) or make as much money. He accepted people for who they were. He could talk to anyone and JAW with the best.

Karl was an incredible athlete. On the racquetball court he moved like a gazelle. His beautiful fluid movements were an art to watch. He was quick as a cobra and as scrappy as a badger. This was a great combination. His greatest asset was not his athletic skill, it was his love for the game. He just loved to play racquetball.

Karl was a phenomenal partner. It was sheer joy to play along side him. He was an unselfish player. Not many players will allow their weaker partner to take every shot that comes their way. He

never "took over" the game, even if it would have resulted in a win. I was an equal partner, which made me a better racquetball player and person because . . . Karl believed in me. I will forever be grateful.

Those who really knew Karl had a love/hate relationship with him. Karl would push, pull, ride, hound, holler, and scold his friends on the court. Sometimes we would reach the point of pushing and hounding back. However, we all knew Karl did this to make us better racquetball players. His methods usually worked. One of these methods is "pure Karl" (this brings a smile to my face). He called any unintentional shot that resulted in a point a "shit shot." We ALL were a little leery about having our shots labeled as such, so we worked just a little bit harder so this wouldn't happen.

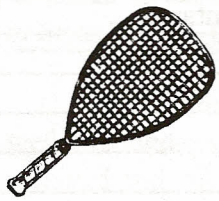
He had many positive methods of teaching: patience, support, and encouragement. He always had these to offer and did it willingly. He would spend hours directing and educating us on the correct swing or shot. And then he would be patient through our trial and errors.

One thing that I always respected about Karl is that he would take responsibility for HIS bad shots. He never blamed them on anybody else or pretended that it didn't happen.

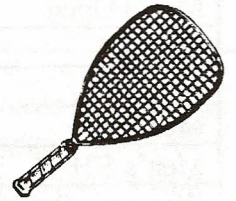
Karl was well loved and respected by all who knew him. He was a kind man, a great racquetball player, and a dear friend. He will truly be missed. Farewell and goodbye.

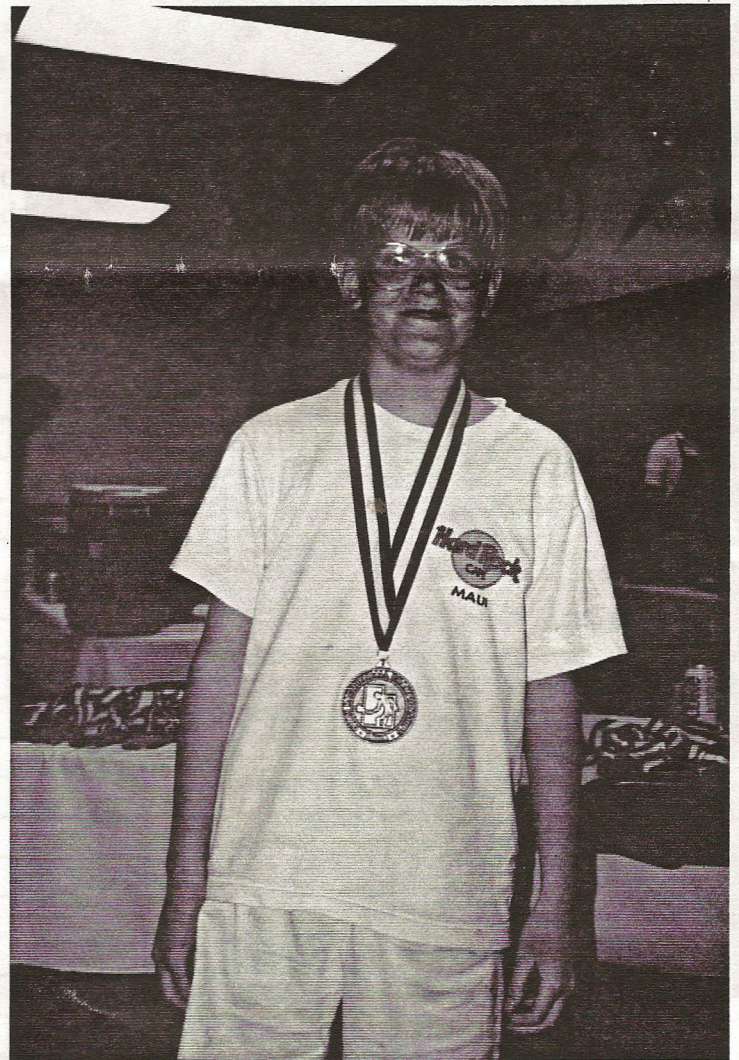

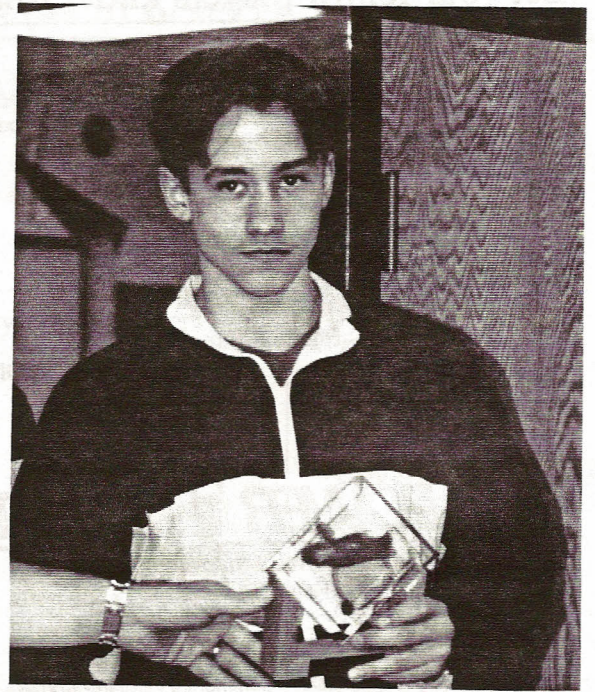

USRA Rule Changes

The USRA Board of Directors accepted the following rule changes that were submitted by the National Rules Committee. The changes are effective on September 30, 1997.

RULE CHANGE #1. If the referee's call of "receiver encroachment" in the return of serve is overturned on appeal AND the return of serve is judged by the referee to be irretrievable, then the outcome of the appeal should be a side-out rather than a replay. See Rule 3.8(e).

RULE CHANGE #2. Revise Rule 4.14(f), as well as any others related to it, to declare that any ball leaving the court results in the immediate loss of the rally by the person/team that hit it last.

RULE CHANGE #3. Modify Rule 3.7(a), as well as any others related to it, to provide that if there are line judges, ANY call (or non-call) may be appealed except for technical fouls and forfeitures.
